

From 4-7 November 2024, the European Holocaust Research Infrastructure held the seminar 'Holocaust and Exile - Approaches, Sources, Methodologies', hosted at the German National Library (DNB) in Frankfurt am Main. Jointly organized by EHRI partner IfZ and

the German Exile Archive 1933-1945 as part of the DNB, 13 participants, most of them researchers and archivists affiliated in Italy, Austria, Germany, Israel, Serbia and Portugal spent four days discussing the link between Holocaust and Exile Studies and the methodologies to approach this research topic that has often been overlooked in the past.
